

RESOLUTION 66-2021

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE PURCHASE OF A CONTAINMENT FILL STATION WITH CASCADE CONTROL PANEL INCLUDING THE TRADE IN OF A COMPRESSED AIR CASCADE SYSTEM PURSUANT TO N.J.S.A. 40A:11-36

WHEREAS, the Woodbury Heights Fire Department has determined that it is in the best interests of the Department and its members to upgrade certain equipment and specifically the existing compressed air cascade system, which will diminish the wear and tear on the Borough's Fire Trucks; and

WHEREAS, Air Power International, Inc of Pennsauken, NJ submitted a proposal to the Fire Department for the appropriate upgrades to said system, which included the trade in of the Department's current "Compressor Air Cascade System" (MAKO model MCFS-2 purchased in 2000 for a cost of \$13,346); and

WHEREAS, Air Power International will supply a Reconditioned SCFS2-3HP Containment Fill Station at a cost of \$4,250.00, which takes into consideration the trade in value of the Department's current air cascade system; and

WHEREAS, the Fire Chief reviewed and recommended approval of the proposal submitted by Air Power International, which he acknowledged will be compatible with the Borough's existing equipment and vehicles.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Borough Council of the Borough of Woodbury Heights, County of Gloucester, does hereby approve the proposal submitted by Air Power International, Inc. and does further authorize the purchase of a Reconditioned SCFS2-3HP Containment Fill Station at a cost not to exceed \$4,250.00 utilizing a trade in of the current Mako Compressor Air Cascade System Model MCFS-2.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the appropriate Borough Officers are hereby authorized to execute any and all documents necessary to effectuate the acquisition of this equipment.


