MINUTES (DRAFT)

Mayor William C. Packer called the meeting to order with the following note: Adequate notice of this meeting has been provided by adopting a schedule of meetings for 2021 which was faxed to the South Jersey Times and Courier Post on January 6, 2021 and posted on the bulletin board in the Municipal Building conforming to the directives of the "Open Public Meetings Act".

Mayor Packer led everyone in the Pledge of Allegiance.

ROLL CALL: Present: Councilman Joseph Getsinger, Councilman Robert Morison, Councilman Harold "Hap" Pye, Councilwoman Cara Witasick, Councilman Richard Gambale, Councilman Jeffrey Pitzo and Mayor William Packer. Also in attendance were Borough Solicitor Brian Lozuke, Borough Engineer Mark Brunermer, and Shannon Elton, Acting Clerk.

MINUTES: A motion to approve the minutes of the Regular Council Meeting September 15th, 2021 was made by Councilman Pye and seconded by Councilwoman Witasick. A roll call vote in favor was unanimous. Councilman Morison abstained. The minutes were approved.

CLERK'S REPORT: Ms. Elton reminded Mayor and Council that the November meeting has been rescheduled to November 23rd due to conflicts with the New Jersey League of Municipalities. Proper notice was given. Report On file.

Mayor Packer announced there would be a closed session to discuss confidential matters, and the agenda would be restructured to go into closed session after the second public portion.

PUBLIC PORTION: Mayor Packer opened the public portion for questions or comments:

Scott Norcross, Clearview Ave: Mr. Norcross appeared on behalf of the Woodbury Heights Fire Association. He expressed concern with people parking in the spots reserved for first responders. He specifically cited incidents during school drop off and pick up. Discussion Ensued.

Maureen McCabe, 454 Elm Ave: Mrs. McCabe declared that she appeared before Mayor and Council requesting a resolution in opposition to the GCL line. She then asked for a resolution as well as a motion and second for such resolution. Mr. Lozuke urged the public to review the website and the reports corresponding to the GCL line. Discussion ensued.

Rose Yerka, 601 Stratford: Mrs. Yerka encouraged Mayor and Council and the public to stay informed and to acknowledge a "Concerned Citizens Group", she referred to resolutions previously passed in support or opposition of certain legislation. Mayor Packer acknowledged that a petition or even referendum is a means for Mayor and Council to listen to the will of the people. Discussion ensued.

Upon hearing no comments, a motion to close the public portion of the meeting was made by Councilwoman Witasick. All of Council agreed. Motion carried.

ENGINEERS REPORT: Mark Brunermer presented on behalf of Sickels & Assoc. Mr. Brunermer gave updates on South Jersey Gas and Walnut Ave. Mr. Brunermer anticipated going to bid on the Walnut Ave project in January. Councilman Morison stressed the importance of traffic control to be present before any projects begin for the day.

Mayor Packer thanked Pat Napoli and weaver Disaster Service for their efforts for Tornado Disaster relief.
