

RESOLUTION 89-2023

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOROUGH OF WOODBURY HEIGHTS, COUNTY OF GLOUCESTER, STATE OF NEW JERSEY REQUESTING APPROVAL OF THE DIRECTOR OF THE DIVISION OF LOCAL GOVERNMENT SERVICES TO ESTABLISH A DEDICATION BY RIDER FOR ACCUMULATED ABSENCES LIABILITY TRUST FUND REQUIRED BY N.J.A.C. 5:30-15

WHEREAS, permission is required of the Direction of the Division of Local Government Services for approval as a dedication by rider of revenues received by a municipality when the revenue is not subject to reasonably accurate estimates in advance; and


WHEREAS, N.J.A.C. 5:30-15 provides for receipt of budget appropriations through annual adopted budgets to provide for the operating costs to administer this act; and

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A:4-39 provides the dedicated revenues anticipated by the Accumulated Absences Liability Trust Fund are hereby anticipated as revenue and hereby appropriated for the purpose to which said revenue is dedicated by Statute or other legal requirement.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Borough Council of the Borough of Woodbury Heights, County of Gloucester, State of New Jersey as follows:

1. The Borough Council of the Borough of Woodbury Heights hereby request permission of the Director of the Division of Local Government Services to pay expenditures for the Accumulated Absences Liability Trust Fund in accordance with N.J.A.C. 5:30-15.
2. The Municipal Clerk of the Borough of Woodbury Heights is hereby directed to forward two certified copies of this resolution to the Director of the Division of Local Government Services.
